Dear Parish Family,

I'm thankful to the Reverend Dr Julia Perry who will be presiding and preaching at the Cathedral on Sunday, as I will be with the Reverend Angela Peverell and the people of the Parish of Muswellbrook, celebrating St Alban's Patronal Festival.

You may have seen some articles and media this week, continuing to discuss the report of The Anglican Church of Australia's national research project into family violence within faith communities. As I wrote last week, the National Anglican Family Violence Project (NAFVP) investigated the prevalence, experience, and impact of family violence for those who identify as Anglicans in Australia. As I write this, as a community we are aware of some COVID-19 cases in Sydney. ***It reinforces again the importance of checking in when we attend worship (or any other place).*** Whilst we in the Hunter have been blessedly COVID-19 free for many months, it's important that we all play our part in ensuring safe communities. There are sign in sheets available for those who don't have mobile phones, or whose mobile phones have difficulty with the QR Code.

If you listen to the ABC 1233 Breakfast Programme on Friday morning (18th June) from 8.30am, you'll hopefully hear Jenny Marchant and I talking about the Cathedral and climbing the Tower. I'm looking forward to the reopening of the Tower climb to the public once the repairs to the carpet in the organ loft have been made.

There will be no celebration of the Eucharist in the Cathedral on Monday 21st June, but apart from that, the Eucharist is celebrated at the Cathedral at 8.30am Monday-Friday, as well as on Tuesday and Thursday at 11.00am at St Peter's Hamilton.

Finally, this week's poem is by an Australian poet, Amy Witting. Witting wrote under a number of pen names, and is perhaps more well known as a novelist than a poet. I came to the poem this week by a circuitous route. After failing to find an appropriate poem for St Alban, I turned to the Gospel this week about Jesus and the storm. Around the Deanery there are many Banksias, and a very large one is in the grounds on the Newcomen Street side. In a storm, this large banksia takes the force of the wind and rain. Like all the trees on the Cathedral site, the truth of Witting's words "but every tree must be its history." is bourne in its limbs. So too, the storms of life shape us too.

Posed by the wind and photographed by time
the banksias stumble, climb,
kneeing the sandy slope behind the beach.
Their thin limbs reach
misshapen, as shame twists, as fears deform,
caught by the root and straining from the storm.

There is no storm now; quiet, air, and sea,
but every tree must be its history.

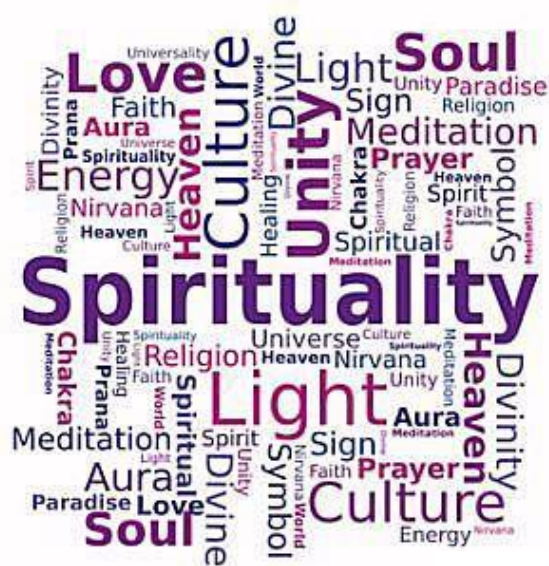

THANKS TO OUR GENEROUS SUPPORTERS

\$20,000 donated by ABM's supporters was sent to the Diocese of Jerusalem and the Middle East to assist people impacted by Beirut's August, 2020 port explosion. The accidental explosion in Beirut's port almost a year ago made headlines around the world. It killed at least 200 people, injured at least 5,000 more, and destroyed homes and businesses within a 5 kilometre radius. It even blew out windows at Beirut International Airport, 9 kilometres away.

The Diocese of Jerusalem reached out to people who lost their homes or who lost their jobs when businesses were affected. ABM's support allowed the Diocese to provide food packages and food vouchers to 200 affected families in 2020, and a further 150 families in early 2021.

One of the families was that of Saeed, a 50-year-old diabetic who lost his job during the economic downturn. His wife's income as a cleaner was not enough to sustain the family of 6, so the family greatly appreciated the food assistance. ABM thanks those in Australia and Beirut who assisted in providing relief to those affected by the Beirut explosion. We continue to pray for those affected, and for the work of the Anglican church in Beirut.

Assets Register – Stoles and Maniples

The drawers of stoles have been completed. There are still many more Textiles to register. These include the banners and frontals and we hope to start on them this week.



Here is a modern stole and a close up of the detail on a much older one. In amongst the stoles was a **maniple**, now mainly redundant in the Anglican Church. It is an embroidered band of silk or similar fabric that is hung over the left arm. It is only used within the context of the [Mass](#).

Originally, the maniple was likely a piece of linen which clerics used to wipe their faces and hands and has been described by some modern commentators as being akin to a handkerchief. It appears to have been used in the [Roman liturgy](#) since at least the 6th century. The maniple can vary widely in size, shape, and degree of [embroidery](#) and ornamentation.

QR Codes – Frequently Asked Questions

What is the QR Code?

QR codes are a common of electronic check-in system which operate like barcodes, with information that can be read by a smartphone camera.

Why do I need to use it?

It is a hygienic, contactless way of recording your attendance for faster contact tracing. At the moment, it is mandatory for attendees at weddings and funerals. We expect that it will soon be mandatory for places of worship.

How does the QR Code work?

Open your smartphone camera and point it at the code square. A notification should come up on the top of the screen on your phone, taking you to the Service NSW App. Login with your details and follow the prompts.

How do I get the App?

You can download the Service NSW App from the App Store.

I've checked in. It says I need to show a member of staff. What do I do now?

Please show your phone screen to a sidesperson, who will mark your name off the list if you have pre-registered or note your attendance for tally purposes.

Can I register multiple people on my device?

Yes. You can register dependents. If you register other people with you, if contact tracing is required, you will be contacted on behalf of these people.

I don't have a smartphone./ My smartphone doesn't recognise the QR Code. What do I do?

Please see one of the sidespeople who will record your attendance on the online form. Thanks for your patience as we learn the new system.

Do I still need to register to attend worship?

It's helpful if we have an idea beforehand about numbers attending services. We'd hate for you to turn up and for there not to be a space for you!

I forgot to check out! Is that a problem?

No. :)

What happens to my personal information?

Your information is sent directly to Service NSW. This means it is readily available for NSW Health to access if it becomes necessary.

Where can I find more information? This website is helpful, <https://www.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/covid-safe/customer-record-keeping/qr-codes> with a handy video at the end of the page. Please ask the Dean, a Warden, or a Parish Council member if you have any concerns.

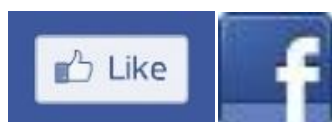
